

- Be clearly and concisely written and contain sufficient information to allow the review committee to assess the research being presented.

Include affiliation for principal or first author only. The e-mail address listed in the submission will be used for all communication. Be sure to list all authors in the abstract. All external sources of support and possible conflicts of interest must be listed and included with the submission.

### **Format**

Strict adherence to the formatting listed below for either Original Work or a Case Report is required. Please type your title as follows: The first letter of each word is capitalized, except for the first letter of each preposition or conjunction. Scientific words can be entered in mixed case (e.g. fMRI). Example: Relationship between Fatigue and Neuropsychological Performance in HIV Infection. Tables, photographs, figures, or references may not be included. All submissions must be in a Word or text document.

## **Format for Original Work**

**Background:** A succinct summary of the literature or theoretical rationale underlying the abstract.

**Objective:** This section should provide the basic rationale for the research and the hypothesis tested.

**Results:** This section should include the statistical approach and details of the analysis (including statistical or

experimental controls) that support the conclusions. Statements such as "results will be discussed" or "data

will be presented" are not acceptable.

**Conclusion:** This section should summarize the essential findings and their implications
