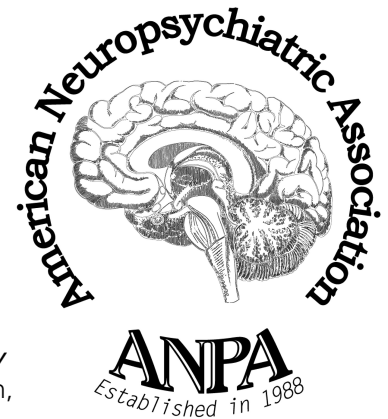


American Neuropsychiatric Association

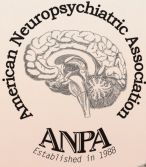
